### NYCC Mission Statement

The New York Center for Children (NYCC) is the only independent center in New York City to provide free, comprehensive evaluation and therapy services to child victims of physical and sexual abuse and their families, for as long as their healing requires.

Dedicated to serving children for over 25 years, NYCC never turns a child in need away, never requires proof of insurance, and always delivers best-practice and personalized therapies to children and families who suffer in silence.

Having served more than 15,000 children and their families, NYCC also delivers groundbreaking training programs on the diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of child abuse, attended by medical students, doctors, nurses, and first responders worldwide. More than 20,000 professionals have been trained through NYCC's educational programs.

The NYCC approach to healing is unmatched, replicable and scalable and serves as a model to centers and their communities nationwide.

### NYCC's Services:

- NYCC offers free therapy to victims of child abuse (sexual abuse, physical abuse, domestic violence and neglect) and their families for as long as needed in order to heal (serving more than 125 children and families annually)
- NYCC trains 100 medical students and residents who come from across the country and around the world for 4-6 weeks residencies to gain skills in diagnosing and treating child abuse.
- NYCC conducts a year-long internship and externship training program for doctoral level psychology students and masters level social work students.
- NYCC offers ongoing child abuse awareness and prevention programs to schools and community organizations across NYC - educating teachers, childcare workers, lawyers, nurses, judges, police officers and other first responders on child abuse recognition and response. Approximately 1,000 individuals are trained by NYCC each year.
- NYCC offers ongoing parenting workshops highlighting healthy parenting and discipline practices
- NYCC holds an annual conference in cooperation with the Administration for Children's Services. The conference features national trauma experts, which has trained nearly 2,000 mental health & multi-disciplinary professionals in the treatment of abuse.
- NYCC provides services to children from New York City, ages 3-21. All services to children and families are free of charge.
